Reception



The children were able to identify the different ways that they have changed since they were babies. We also had a workshop from the Chertsey Museum. The children learned about the past through handling artefacts, role play and crafts.

We have also been lucky enough to have skateboarding or scooting workshops. We were all very impressed with the children's perseverance and resilience and it was lovely to see their confidence develop throughout. In addition to this, the children took part in a Chinese New Year dance workshop. It was an excellent way to introduce the celebration and they spent the following week applying their learning and comparing this to the other festivals and celebrations that we have explored so far this year. What a busy half term it's been!









<u>Year 1</u>

In DT, we have been building taxis! We learnt about the structure, designed our own and then built them. We have been very impressed with the results! We learnt all about London landmarks in our Geography and imagined our Black Cabs having to

drive across our busy capital city.



This half term we went all dotty at The Oaktree school. We learnt about Yayoi Kasama and her dotty art, which inspired us to make a variety of different pieces or artwork of our own. We were amazed by the wonderful artwork that the children made for our art exhibition and were so happy to see how well attended the exhibition was.





Year 2

This has been an exciting term for the children as they have spent time exploring 'The Secret of Black Rock' by Joe Todd-Stanton. They have thought carefully about what the secret might have been as well as creating their own, exciting ending. They have also been experimenting with different materials as part of their Science topic, finding out which materials bend, absorb and are waterproof. To finish off an exciting half term, the children went on a school trip to the Blue Reef Aquarium in Southsea where they looked at the different sea creatures, learning about their habitats. The children also took a walk along the seafront to see the different features of a coastline including the signs, flags or windsocks that you might find there. We all had so much fun!





<u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 have come to the end of their topic on Ancient Egypt. A highlight of the topic was mummifying tomatoes to learn more about the process in a hands-on way. To finish off the topic, they had a History Day with a visit from Freshwater Theatre where they put their learning to the test! They entered Tutankhamun's tomb, searching for treasure and made their own amulets with hieroglyphics on.















As part of our RE studies, Year 4 have been studying Sikhism. There are three pillars of Sikhism, namely prayer, giving and work.

As a novel way to remember the three pillars, the classes put their DT skills to good use and made paper statues









<u>Year 5</u>

We have had lots of fun and learning this term on The Tudors. We looked at portraits of the key figures of the time and then drew our own. In English, we wrote diary entries and a persuasive letter. In DT, we used the backstitch and blanket stitch to create Tudor puppets. To show that they have a purpose, we then used them to perform a Tudor play, which we thoroughly enjoyed.

Wilder schools

"This year, as part of the <u>Wilder Schools</u> programme, <u>Surrey Wildlife Trust</u> are joining The Hermitage and Oaktree Schools to help students improve their school grounds for nature and take more of their learning outdoors.

Surrey's wildlife is in decline, but by taking some simple actions at home, we can all help create a Nature Recovery Network across the county.

Action for Nature – Bee Positive this Spring!

Our disappearing pollinators need help, but fortunately <u>pots and containers are a great</u> <u>way of introducing insect-friendly flowers at home</u>. They are also perfect for small gardens or spaces like window ledges or roofs.

Sow your own mini wildflower meadow in a windowbox, or use walls to create vertical herb displays.

You can use anything you like for planting! How about...

- 1. Watering cans
- 2. Old kettles
- 3. Metal pails and buckets
- 4. Pans and colanders

If you don't have your own outdoor space at home, **why not take part in the <u>Big Plastic</u>** <u>Count</u> next month?

Our Forest School

As part of our commitment to providing quality educational experiences, The Oaktree and The Hermitage Schools are proud to offer pupils the chance to participate in Forest School sessions. We have three fully qualified employees working with our schools who have a timetable to ensure that ALL children will experience a full programme of forest school during their education at The Oaktree School and again during their four years at The Hermitage School.

During Forest School, challenging outdoor experiences promote the development of the key skills of communication, problem solving and decision making, which have value across a range of occupations. They encourage a positive "opting in" and "can do" attitude. Children's horizons are broadened, new challenges come to be relished and perseverance and determination are reinforced. Skills such as emotional growth, self-esteem, confidence and independence are nurtured and the woodland environment gives learners time and space to be by themselves, find peace and communicate with others. Risk is experienced by children in a managed way, teaching them about the importance of risk awareness and risk management – not risk avoidance.

This means that they are expected to attend meetings and be involved in decision making at the highest levels of Mindworks. Their main purpose is to diversify the voices in these meetings to make sure that the voices of children and young people are included in key decision making.

The family friendly event will see performances, treasure hunts, arts, and crafts as well as stalls run by the Mindworks Team. The event is a fantastic way to have your say in mental health services and how they are run but also find out more about the resources available to young people in the area. 


Attendance

Dear Parents/Carers,

Further to my previous messages, newsletters and reminders I continue to get concerns from local residents and other parents about poor parking around our site. But this week I have sadly received an email from JP Mealing, the General Manager of The Surrey Public house on Hermitage Road.



He shares "There have been numerous incidents where parents are what I would describe as nuisance parking, this includes using the disabled bays when they do not have a blue badge, blocking gates and fire exits, and blocking in my customers cars. I have plenty of photo evidence of this."

The Surrey have kindly extended a privilege to our parents who are not using their facilities, to use the car park but he has shared If this driving behaviour persists, he will begin barring parents from using their car park.

So I ask for this

- Do not use the disable parking bay unless you have a blue badge
- Do not block the rear gates or any fire exits
- Do not block in any other cars

If there are no spaces, either wait, or go somewhere else

We kindly ask for all parents of The Hermitage and The Oaktree Schools to show consideration for our locals, his customers and our children when parking.
