Reading- Decoding



- Children can identify and read words with Set 1, 2 and 3 sounds (see sound mats)
- Children can read most common exception words. (see word mats)
- Recognise the common suffixes: -s, -es, -ing, -ed, -er and -est.

End of year expectations

Reading- Comprehension

Range of reading:

Listen attentively to a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction.

Familiarity with texts:

- Recall basic features of stories, retelling them in order and identify the characteristics of the story.
- Identify the predictable phrases.

Understanding:

Check the text makes sense and self-correct.

Inference:

- Demonstrate simple inferences.
- Discuss the links between events and the text title.

Prediction:

Predict what might happen to the characters, plot and language.

Discussing:

- Contribute thoughts and ideas, remembering key events and information.
- Can express views about the characters and events in a text.



Phonics Common exception words



Year 1 Phonics Screener



- Children will be asked to read 40 'real or nonsense' words
- These are made up of the different set 1, 2 and 3 sounds.
- They are encouraged to 'spot the sound' before sounding the word out
